Mt. Airy Boys & Girls Club



TEEN LEADERSHIP RETREAT

VOYAGEUR ENVIRONMENTAL CENTER

During the weekend of January 5-7, 2018, the Boys & Girls Clubs of the Twin Cities kicked off our first annual Teen Leadership Retreat at Camp Voyageur. The purpose of the Leadership Retreat was for teens from Boys & Girls Clubs from across the state of Minnesota to gather together to network, improve their leadership skills, and prepare for the Youth of the Year competition. The first day of the retreat consisted of team-building activities and an opportunity to socialize with other Club members during Casino Night. Day two was filled with workshops throughout the day! Through the workshops, youth were able to learn more about what qualities define a good romantic partner, how to become more civically involved in their communities, how to define their personal brand, and how to budget their money using the Money Matters curriculum.









Teens were given the opportunity to explore their future career options and to learn about their personality type with the Find Your Fit program. Through the program, teens were able to see which work environment would suit them the best and expand their knowledge about possible career options. Concurrently, Youth of the Year candidates engaged in a two hour training, which covered different aspects of the Youth of the Year process. Teens were given an opportunity to practice their interview skills, given tips on how to deliver their speech, and learned more about their personal brand and their vision for America's youth. Candidates also witnessed a panel of past Youth of the Year winners from across the state and were given an opportunity to ask them questions about their experiences as Youth of the Year. The night ended with more team building activities such as snowshoeing, sledding, card games, and enjoying some delicious s'mores around the camp fire. Sunday morning was spent reflecting on the teens' Leadership Retreat experience.
