


AUGUST 2020 NEWSLETTER



In June, Boys & Girls Clubs across the country began collaboration on a new teen social justice initiative called **Be The Change You Want 2 See**. This new initiative amplifies youth voices and activism through critical and intentional conversations, artistic expression and service projects. The goal is to educate and inspire teen Club members to be catalysts for change across our nation.

On August 5, this initiative scaled up to a national, multi-city Teen Empowerment Town Hall that tackled timely issues of social and racial justice impacting teens in America today. Following opening remarks from Boys & Girls Clubs of America (BGCA) CEO Jim Clark, teens engaged in lively discussions on topics including police reform, criminal justice reform and grassroots activism.



Participating in the town hall were teen Boys & Girls Club members from the Twin Cities, Houston, Metro Atlanta, St. Louis, Washington, D.C., and San Francisco. Twin Cities participants included Kaysha Shaw, 2020 Minnesota Youth of the Year Ke'la Scuefield, and 2019 Midwest Youth of the Year Anaa Jibicho.

We are very proud of our teens, and Club teens across the country, for making their voices heard and their efforts to listen, share and educate! We look forward to participating in future events and continuing to support avenues of advocacy for our young people.



Serving Our Families in the New School Year

School districts are choosing distance learning for fall, leaving many families in a difficult situation and needing greater

support from the Clubs. We plan to reopen the following Clubs after Labor Day for small-group, in-person, all day programming: Jerry Gamble and Southside Village in Minneapolis, and Mt. Airy, East Side and Al Lenzmeier West Side in St. Paul. East Side will focus on in-person teen programming, while the other Clubs will focus on inperson K-5 programming.

Our reopening plan involves a structured partnership with parents/guardians and teachers as BGCTC takes on a more



As we move into our school year reopen plan, we will bring the Family Meal Kits program and Southside Village pop-up food pantry to a close; going back to our traditional Kids Feeding Kids model with on-site nutritious meals being served at all open Club locations. We will also continue connecting Club families who aren't able to be with us for in-person programming and are experiencing food insecurity to alternate community resources during this time. With funding, BGCTC will continue exploring ways to expand our role in advancing food security in the future.
